## Scouts protest use of its 3-fingure salute by Narc-K

THE Kenva Scouts Association (KSA) has protested the compued use by Narcthe three-finger salut ociated with the scou girl guides move-ments world wide.

Yesterday as the controversy surrounding the symbol resurfaced at a media forum in Nairobi, KSA demanded that the party stops using it "once and for all."

During the unveiling of a programme for the celebrations to mark 100 years of the movement's existence around the world, the association's officials sent a passionate appeal to the party to reconsider its decision

and stop using the salute.

The officials expressed fears that continued use of the salute by Narc-Kenya will cause a clash of symbols between a political movement and a social one.

The World Organisa-tion of Scouts Movement Secretary General, Eduardo Missoni supported KSA's sentiments that, the use of the salute by Narc-Kenyn would mean an imminent

would mean an imminent clash of salutes.

National Assembly Speaker Francis Ole Kaparo who is also the Scouts Commissioner General last year while presiding over a scouts function in Kapenguria, West Pokot, called on Narc-Kenya to reconsider the decision to use the salute as its symbol and even suggested that, they should change and use the lake "Scouting is a non-political movement and we will

"But, since it's a problem in Kenya now, we have in-stituted our legal adviser, P.L.O. Lumumba to work on the patenting the symbol,' said Miriti.

The officials, Miriti said are exploring possibilities of sharing their predicament with KSA Patron, President Mwai Kibaki and implore him to intervene if Narc-Kenya insists on using the salute. Since the establishment of the party, the president has been associated with it as a vehicle through which he is likely to seek another term at State House.

At the same time, he said the Scouts Movement Leadership was following up on the matter.

The association's emblem is captured in Cap 2 (19) of the Kenyan laws as an Act of Parliament was established in 1909 and is protected.
